Headteacher's News

One of the targets of Courtney's School Improvement Plan this year is to increase the proportion of children achieving their age-expected standard in maths at the end of each year. From analysing our data, we have targeted the following areas:

- Basic number recall (number bonds to ten and multiplication facts)
- Using our maths right across the curriculum to keep new learning fresh and relevant
- Revisiting new learning more than once in the year so that it becomes embedded e.g. area and perimeter

How you can help at home:

- Encourage your child to go onto Times Table Rock Stars (especially KS2) for 10 mins at least 3 times a week.
- Use car journeys, walking to school to practise number bonds, facts
- Squeeze all of the maths you can out of everyday activities e.g. reading a scale if cooking or making a drink
- Give your child space to do their homework and go through it with them once they have done all they can.

Feedback to the teacher in the comment section how they got on.

At the moment, we are testing the children's maths from Y2-Y6 in order to identify any gaps and who needs to accelerate their learning. We will be trialling later-than-usual- parents/carers evenings this year, so that the teachers can share these outcomes with you and provide you with more accurate areas in which you can support at home.


