## Headteacher's News

### Dear Parents/carers

We have had a wonderful start to term and have enjoyed getting back to some normality. We have had our first whole school celebration assembly today which was also my first whole school assembly in person! It just reminds me how far we have come. Our certificates this week are a real celebration of success and your child/children have been tasked with the challenge of making themselves proud this weekend. It could be by sharing with siblings, helping with chores (I suggest you run with this one) or telling someone how special they are. We look forward to hearing all about these next week.

### Reception

A huge well done to our wonderful new starters in Reception, the children have successfully completed a full week of mornings or afternoons and have had a wonderful time, making friends, building new relationships and engaging in new learning through play. Well done to our reception parents too, whether it is your first child starting school or your last, the transition into school life can bring mixed emotions and can be challenging. It is encouraging to see how children are settling.

### Meet the teacher

It has been a great opportunity for our parents and carers and staff to meet and get to know each other during our meet the teacher sessions. We hope to be able to offer more opportunities for you to come into school while we continue on our journey back to normal school life.

### Newsletter

We are trialling sending a fortnightly newsletter and will be engaging with different year groups to take a lead on this. You will begin to see a change in the format as we want our children and classes to be empowered to share their voice so watch this space!

### COVID

You will have seen on doors that staff are no longer wearing masks and are happy to inform you this is no longer a requirement on the school site. We are still encouraging no more than one parent at drop off and pick up to help reduce our interaction with potential close contacts.

The school are diligently responding to guidance and updates and often hear about them as soon as you do. We appreciate your patience with us and will continue to update you as and when we receive further information. Things are different this year, as mentioned in the last communication from the local authority we are now relying on **NHS Test and Trace to undertake close contact monitoring**. As a result, if there are any confirmed positive



cases in school, we will **not be notifying you** and communication will be coming via NHS Test and Trace if they deem your child is a close contact of a positive case. We will however notify you if we meet one of the following **thresholds**:

· *5 children, pupils, students or staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period; or*

· *10% of children, pupils, students or staff who are likely to have mixed closely test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period.* (DFE)

Once a threshold is met we seek external advice from the Local Authority Public Health to take appropriate action to reduce further transmissions.

We recognise this change may feel strange, however as we begin to come out of restrictions we continue to adapt practice while maintaining good practice.

Once again, we appreciate your support with this and want to reassure you we are following all guidance.

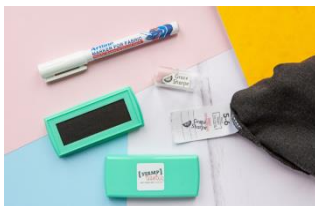
