- There is only a small range of clubs but this is understandable due to funding and Courtney being a small school. We are extremely pleased with Miss Elmore's attitude and enthusiasm, considering it is her first year in teaching. (Y2)
- I do not agree that children in Reception class should have to adhere to the same rules as the rest of the school and I raised this at the last parents' evening. Four and five year olds need immediate discipline and a chance to redeem themselves. Otherwise there is no understanding or motivation to choose the right path. This process does not appear to be working for my child who appears to be consistently getting into trouble each week. She is strong-willed rather than malicious and there seems to be an inconsistent approach to dealing with her behaviour mainly due to multiple persons in authority. (YR)
- We are very happy to send our children to Courtney and they both enjoy school.
- The addition of Breakfast and After School Clubs have made a big difference to us.
- Miss Elmore and Mrs Matthews have worked with us this year with regards to my child's behaviour at home which has been a great support. (Y2)
- My child has been disappointed with the new behaviour scheme. Whilst she has never had a warning, she has only ever made it to silver, whilst she has seen class mates who have had constant warnings and been moved down the tree also go up to gold. (Y2)
- Whilst my son has made progress, we do not feel that he has made the progress he has potential for.... After 2 ½ years of disrupted teaching he is working at the expected standard we would have expected him to be further ahead than this. (Y4)
- With regards to the new behaviour rewards, it does not seem to be recognised when children are just good all of the time. My child hasn't even had a warning and still has only made it to gold once. (Y4)

My child attends scooter and multi-skills club, but reports back that they mostly mess about and have fun rather than learn/practise sports/scooter skills. (Y4)

- New behaviour policy is great especially the stickers for gold/silver. I also like that there is a clear 'warning' before amber/red. (Y4)
- I couldn't do without Breakfast Club so out of school clubs are essential and my son loves going to Breakfast Club too so added bonus! (Y4)
- Having a few male teachers is also a plus and positive point for us my son has loved having Mr Thomas and is now equally excited about joining Year 5 and Mr Jones' class. (Y4)
- Range of clubs is excellent. (Y4)
- I feel the reading reward scheme is a total waste of time. My child reads every single night at home and I always tick his reading book and write in his book if it's his school book that he has chosen to read. His book has not been changed or has he read with a teachers since O8.06.17 and it's the 29.06.17 today. Why bother to put a reward scheme in place when it is not carried out. My son has totally lost interest. (Y2)
- My child transferred to Courtney mid-way through the year. I have seen a real change in his attitude to learning. He is happy to go to school and keen to learn. (anon)
- The Crown Values system keeps all pupils focused on expected behaviour, there are just not the sort of conflicts that occurred in his previous school. (Y4)

- The school clubs are good however my child found that eating a bit after 12ish meant that she was late for the start , this means she no longer attends. (Y2)
- Would love to see a few more practical skills clubs after school, maybe Arts, crafts, sewing and basic cookery skills. (Y2)

- Overall a fantastic school with a friendly feel to it. (Y2)
- Home learning is really valued always marked/displayed. (Y2)
- Really positive year with Miss Elmore who has regularly communicated if/when there have been concerns. Great relationship with the children. (Y2)
