Headteacher's News

Dear Parents/carers

What a busy week we have had in school. Our children have been working hard building confidence and taking risks. Y4 have been busy making bread following instructions and were confidently able to tell me the process of 'proving' their dough. Y2 have been excited about their new class text with one child excitedly ordering their own copy and Y5 have been working with Ms Britt and Mr Mason our sports coaches to build on their gymnastics skills successfully executing forward rolls and 3 point balances and jumps.

COVID update

On the 27th January the government announced in England, face coverings are no longer required by law.

The government suggests that you continue to wear a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces where you may come into contact with other people you do not normally meet.

From Monday 31st January we are no longer asking you to wear masks at drop off or pick. Our staff will be choosing whether they wear masks in school.

We have kept the wearing of face coverings in communal areas due to an increased number of COVID-19 cases. Whilst our number have been considerably lower than other schools, they are still higher than we have been used to so wanted to reduce risk of transmission during this spike.

Please respect staffs decisions to continue to wear masks in continuing to keep both themselves and our community safe. If we see an increase in numbers or bubbles closures, we will need to revise practice accordingly.

We appreciate all of your continued support with this and understanding at a time when we had all thought we would no longer need to think about mask wearing.

Restrictions introduced in December to deal with Omicron will cease on 26 Jan



Face masks no longer compulsory in indoor public spaces **from 27 Jan** or for secondary pupils in classrooms from **Thurs 20 Jan**



Guidance to work from home has ended



Covid passes - proof of full vaccination or recent negative test - will no longer be mandatory for entry to nightclubs and other large venues

Measures still in place



The legal requirement to self-isolate if you test positive for Covid will remain for now

The Dog House is set at the animal charity Wood Green in Cambridgeshire and has been described as both 'charming' and 'compassionate'. The programme follows prospective owners as they are matched with a rescue dog, specially selected by the expert team of matchmakers at Wood Green.
