Headteacher's News

Good afternoon parents and carers,

We have had another successful week here at Courtney. You may have noticed how exhausted your child/children were on the weekend after a full week back with everyone in. At points over the next few weeks, every child (and adult) is going to be exhausted, if they are not already. This is to be expected due to the change of routine with sleep patterns, longer learning time vs taking breaks and walking the dog when needed.

To support your child/children allow some relaxation time over the weekend for all of you as a family to enjoy. Sometimes sitting in front of the TV is not enough, try playing a family game or cooking a meal together. Provide them with lots of praise (be specific) for persevering with bedtime routines, waking up in a positive mood (or waking up at all) and helping siblings get ready for school. Ask them what they were proud of this week in school? Which piece of work would they have wished you would have been able to see? It can be a struggle to get information about the school day from children sometimes but keep questions positive and open.

You may or may not be aware that today (Friday 19th March) is RED NOSE DAY. We as a school decided not to add this to our week to support many families with familiarising themselves with routines and to ease pressures of trying to find something red or consoling a son or daughter once a red nose has been lost. Roof Works

We are delighted that long overdue work to our leaking roof is finally scheduled. The works are going to start in the Easter Holidays and run for most of terms 5 and 6.

Scaffolding will be constructed in school and also outside the school running from the KS2 entrance all the way down to the KS1 entrance. The external scaffolding will be fenced off and the internal scaffolding will be made safe to children. The roofers will not have any access inside school and logistics will be planned so they will operate in a completely distinct bubble. We are consulting with Health and Safety experts to ensure the works are carried out as safely as possible.

There are a number of implications for our pupils and you parents.

The corridor in school will be much darker and there may be noise from above. There will be some poles in the corridor and waiting space in the playground will be more limited.

We will be talking to our children on their first day back about the works and how they can navigate the scaffolding safely.

We would ask that you prepare your children for the works in advance of their return after Easter if you believe this may alleviate any anxiety. We would also ask that you continue to socially distance in the playground, even with the more limited space.

Thank you all for your patience with these works. It has taken 4 years of hard work to get the work scheduled. Whilst the timing is not ideal, the long term benefits will out-weigh the added complexities.
