One of the values we encourage our children to develop is one of giving back. This week our school choir has been doing just that. Children's attendance is sometimes really difficult to keep high just because of the normal range of illnesses and sickness that go round at school. School Uniform

We have had a query this week about whether or not leggings are allowed as part of the school uniform. Just to clarify, we would prefer trousers and skirts to be worn but, as long as the leggings (not jeggings) are black, this is perfectly acceptable.

A reminder of other uniform-related rules:

1. **Hair clips** should be no bigger than the width of a palm and be school colours. So no jojo bows and no non-uniform colours.
2. **Footwear** should be plain black (with no white parts), ideally shoes but plain black trainers are allowed.

Please, please could you put your child's name in all their clothing as they invariably get muddled up.

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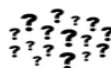
