This year we will be joining in with the National "Wear A Christmas Jumper Day" on **Friday 13<sup>th</sup> December**. We have chosen to support the charity **Help Homeless Bristol**, a voluntary led group which provides vital support to the homeless close to where we live. I am sure that you will agree that homelessness is a big issue and with the cold weather and the onset of Christmas it is even more saddening for those without a place to call home.

With that in mind we are asking that pupils kindly bring to school a small monetary contribution e.g.

50p or an item from the following list:

Bottled water, fizzy drinks, fruit juice, pot noodle type foods, individually wrapped snack bars, mini marshmallows, chocolate, biscuits, crisps, cereal bars, cuppa soup/ pasta packets, sanitary wear, wet wipes, roll on deodorant, mini shower gel/ shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes, mini tissue packs.

Any new warm socks, gloves, scarves and hats would be very gratefully received and any preloved warm coats, sleeping bags and tents would be put to very good use. *(If money is tight, please do not feel obliged to send in a donation; nobody will notice who has or who has not contributed but a jumper may still be worn.)*

### Year 5 Shoe Making Workshop

On Tuesday, Year 5 were very lucky to receive a shoe making workshop from Ollie and Lucy from Ottowin Footwear. They are Cordwainers (leather shoe makers) who use traditional tools and methods to make very high-quality footwear. Year 5 were struck by their enthusiasm, passion and expertise in making shoes. They were given demonstrations and shown how to use tools: clicking knife; lasting pincers; hole puncher; awl and leather hammers. This workshop ties in brilliantly with the topic of 'What did the Victorians do for us?'. There was a huge shoe making industry in and around Kingswood with factories in Kingswood, Hanham and inner city Bristol during the Victorian era. With a growing need for reducing waste and recycling, the children in Year 5 are using 100% recycled materials to make shoes for themselves. We will share our wonderful creations by the end of term. Thank you Ollie and Lucy for such an immersive and interesting workshop.
