Welcome to Term 4. Already the days are starting to get lighter and there are the first signs of Spring appearing. We have started this term off with a buzz, by organising some 'immersion' events and giving the children opportunities to engage with the themes of their new book before they start reading. Lime Class (Y3) were invaded by Maple Class to start off their Romans work; Sycamore Class (Y5) got to handle real hearts as the start to their book 'Pig Heart Boy'; and Ash Class (Y2) went on a pirate clue treasure hunt to start off their pirate-themed topic. Every class has one main reading book each term to use as the core focus for their English work. The text chosen reflects the whole class topic or is a storyline which is relevant to, and will engage, the children. Quality vocabulary is 'magpied' from the book and then used in the children's own writing. Thank you to all of you who are managing to read with your child for 10-15 minutes five times a week. 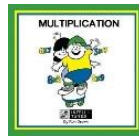

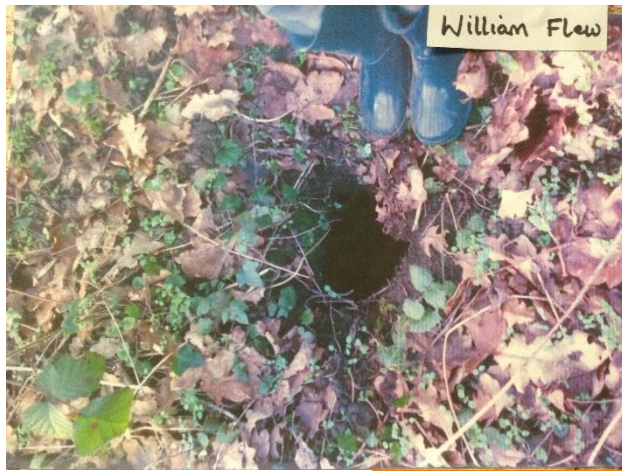
