

**Oak Class Topic Map – What’s growing in our garden?**  
**Term 1 2018-2019 Teacher: Miss Inman**

<b>English</b> In English, we will be using the book Peter Rabbit as the stimulus for our writing. We will be concentrating on developing our letter formation and our understanding of grammar by writing descriptions of character and settings.  We will be using our story maps to help retell stories, orally. This will lead into our final writing outcome, where we will produce a story based on our own retelling.  We will be learning about structuring sentences correctly as well as how to punctuation simple sentences. In phonics we are revisiting our digraphs learnt from Reception.		<b>Maths</b> In Maths we will be working on our understanding of the value of number and what numbers up to 20 represent. With Mrs Parker - we shall begin looking at counting in different values (getting us ready for our Multiplication Masters)  We will then move on to adding and subtracting numbers and money and improving our ability to work out word problems. As always there is a whole school focus on developing our children’s reasoning and problem solving skills. Throughout the year, there will be a large focus on times table facts, and children will have a weekly opportunity to gain their multiplication badges.	<b>Science</b> This term our Science topic is ‘Plants’, where we will be looking at what (and how) things grow in our garden.  We will be looking at the life cycle of plants and the way a seed grows. This will include thinking about all the things plants need to grow. We will be observing what happens if our seeds do not get all of their key ingredients.  The school’s grounds will become the focus for some of our lessons as we explore different ways seeds may be able to travel around. The children will also get their “green fingers” on as they help Mrs Hodds in the Courtney allotment with digging and planting!
<b>History/ Geography</b> Although our main topic is a science based one, we will still have a few elements of history and geography within it.  Our ‘Big Issue’ within geography this year is <i>Recycling</i> . We will be looking at how and why we recycle materials to help the environment.  Towards the end of the term, to mark the centenary anniversary of the ending of World War I, the whole school will look at why and how we still remember them.		<b>Art and Design Technology</b> Art and Design Technology will be taught by Mrs Harbury on a Tuesday afternoon.  William Morris is our term’s artist, who the class will base the majority of their art around – they will be encouraged to analyse pieces of his work and try to replicate different elements of it.  Ash class will do this by using the outside environment to produce pieces of work which will tie into our topic.	<b>PE</b> As a school we follow the “Real PE” scheme of work which focuses on building up core skills and applying them in games. On Tuesday the children will have a PE session with Mr Smith, our sports coach. On Thursday the children will be doing PE with Mr Jones.  If your child has long hair please make sure it is tied up on these days, and that they can take out their earrings. All children should have suitable PE kit kept at school.
<b>Computing</b> In computing, we will be looking into E-safety: how we can keep ourselves safe whilst online and who we can go to when needed.	<b>Religious Education</b> Our religious question for the term is “What does it mean to belong to a faith community?” We will compare difference and similarities between the different communities that we are a part of.	<b>PHSE</b> From our Jigsaw scheme of work, we will be looking at “Being me in my world”. This unit looks into recognising feelings (especially when faced with something new).	<b>Dates for the diary</b> Tuesday 11 <sup>th</sup> September (3:20pm) – Meet the teacher.
