Headteacher's News

This week I wanted to give you an update on our home learning provision. If there is a need for us to close a bubble in the near future, we will continue to use the blog system and the class email that we all became familiar with in the first lockdown in order to communicate with the children. As with everything we do at school, we reflect on the impact of our provision, collect ideas from the wider community and then improve our practice to make it even better. The improvements we will be making initially, is the introduction of daily meetings with the class so that we can make sure the children are up and ready to engage in their learning and that they have the opportunity to interact with each other and the teacher and we can check on wellbeing.

The next step we are now working on, led by Mr Green who has expertise in the area, is developing the school's use of Google Classrooms which will allow us to: differentiate the learning for groups or individual learners as appropriate; more easily upload videos; set an expectation of work to be submitted to keep the children on track; allow us to monitor hand-in rates; and allow the teachers to give personalised feedback on each child's 'next steps' (as is the normal practice when they are at school). We intend to roll it out initially as the format for delivering homework so that you and the children can familiarise yourselves with logging on from home and we can iron out any glitches. Watch this space!

If there is an aspect of home-learning that you think would be useful for us to add to our provision, please do let us know so that we can consider it within the bigger picture.

Thank you to our school community who have embraced the wearing of masks at drop off and pick up as recommended. Experiencing the community working well together is so reassuring, especially with positive Covid cases and bubble closures so high in our locality at the moment.

And finally, the end of my term as Headteacher of Courtney in four weeks' is starting to become a reality as I start my 'last time' events. This week saw my last full governing body meeting and my last report to governors. I have started the handover process, remotely of course, to Ms Georgina Scott who will be taking up her post in these extraordinary times; it reminds me of what a complex and interconnected the world of school is. **Deborah Wood**


Christmas Shopping Virtual Balloon Race / Win a Christmas Hamper!!
