Headteacher's News

Firstly, the transition to Miss Scott taking over as Headteacher next term continues. We have had several online meetings so she can learn how the school works and where we feel the next part of the journey in our continued improvement should be. I have shared a recording with the classes of a meeting between us in which she answered some questions the children had set as part of starting to get to know her a little better. See if your child can remember anything they heard.

The final week of term

I am fully aware that nearly all of the families of both the children and staff will have plans to see some of their family members over the Christmas period and that some of those people are vulnerable. I am also aware that nobody wants the news that they must self-isolate over the Christmas period if it can be avoided. Therefore, in order to minimise any risks that being at school may present and the number of contacts made, we are making a few changes.

In the last week of term, rather than classes being joined in bubbles and staff working in more than one bubble, we are making changes so that each class will stay in its own separate bubble with its own members of staff (as long as any unforeseen absences allow). This is not a sustainable model longer term, but for a week we feel that it is doable especially if it means the children can more confidently see their grandparents. We won't be changing the drop off and pick up arrangements, apart from Year 6 being allowed through slightly earlier so that they don't need to wait alongside Year 5 pupils.

Out of School Clubs

We realise that our Breakfast and After School Clubs are indispensable for some of you but they do slightly increase the risk for both your child and the staff. If, during this last week of term, you could cut down the use of these services to the bare minimum, would you please do that.

Christmas Dinner

In order to keep the occasion as festive and fun as we can, we will be bringing the school Christmas dinner forward a week so that next week (beginning 7th December) KS2 children will have their Christmas dinner on Tuesday and KS1 will be having their dinner on Wednesday. The wearing of Christmas jumpers is encouraged! Christmas panto

Friends of Courtney Primary School have kindly booked an online pantomime for each class to enjoy as the term comes to an end. It will certainly spread some joy so thank you to them.
