English

We will begin the second instalment in the Cogheart adventures: **Moonlocket** by Peter Bunzl

We will write our own innovated stories after revising some key Y4 grammar skills. We will build on these

to learn how to vary the position of commas in multi-clause sentences. Using a range of descriptive techniques, we will describe the character of Jack Door and the prison he escapes from.

We will enjoy a range of poems written in the Victorian era. We will learn how to precisely use phrases and vocabulary to describe and use figurative language (metaphors, personification and repetition).



In Maths this term we will be covering the following skills: Block 1 – place value, including: reading, writing numbers and understanding the value of each

digit in numbers up to 1,000,000; comparing and ordering numbers; rounding numbers; Roman Numerals; negative numbers

Block 2 – mental addition and subtraction Block 3 – written addition and subtraction. Blocks 2 and 3 will include problem solving, including statistics, money and measures, estimation and using inverse operations to check answers.

Science

We will begin the year by developing our planning skills through the context of learning about the properties of materials and how this determines which materials



different objects are made from. The topic title will be: **A Material World**.

Planning skills include learning how to: ask questions and choose suitable types of enquiry in order to find the answers; controlling variables; choosing equipment; making predictions; writing methods.

We will be carrying out a range of experiments to find out about the properties of different materials and whether they are: transparent, magnetic, flexible, strong, hard, conductors or insulators of heat and electricity etc as well as producing fact files to show the differences and similarities between materials.

History/Geography

We are all looking forward to our trip to Sevington on Friday 13th July.

In the remainder of our topic we will be discussing life as a rich and poor children as well as comparing their lives to our own. We will plot key dates through the Victorian era on our own timelines. These will be used throughout the topic.





Computing

To enable us to learn more about the Victorian era, we will be researching key information on the ipads and laptops. As part of this, we will recap safe searching and how to use the internet safely.

French

We will start by learning to talk about our holidays. Then we will link our learning to other areas of the curriculum, such as counting in numbers and recording in Roman Numerals, learning the names of instruments and materials.
