English

Our class text will be a version of **The Tiger Child** by Joanna Troughton

We will be learning the following grammar skills:

- Write complex sentences using a range of conjunctions
- Use the present perfect form of verbs
- Use standard English and explore when non-standard English could be used
- Use the language features of narrative
- Use the language features of non-fiction
- Spell at least half of the Y3/4 common exception words, homophones and words from other origins.
- Spell words using some of the Y3/4 prefixes and suffixes.

Maths

In Maths this term we will be covering the following skills:


Statistics

- Interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms and tables.
- Solve one-step and two-step questions [for example, 'How manymore?' and 'How many fewer?'] using information presented in scaled bar charts and pictograms and tables.

Measurement - length and perimeter

- Measure, compare, add and subtract: lengths (m/cm/mm); mass (kg/g); volume/capacity (I/ml).
- Measure the perimeter of simple 2D shapes.

Computing





During this unit we will be learning to: use commands to control a floor robot, solve problems with a floor robot and replicate their solutions on screen, use commands to write an algorithm and program, test and debug a program, use repeat in logo to write a program, write an algorithm using a visual programming language to achieve an outcome, explain how an algorithm solves a problem and write a program in which an object is used to trigger an action.



Topic

This term we are going to be exploring the question: What is life like in India?

We will be looking at where India and its capital is on a map, writing comparisons between Egyptian and Hindu gods and exploring the differences between a child's life in India and our own school day.



Our focus in science is Forces and Magnets. As part of this unit, we will:

- -compare how things move on different surfaces.
- Notice that some forces need contact between two objects but magnetic forces can act at a distance.
- -Observe how magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and not others.
- -Compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of whether they are attracted to a magnet and identify some magnetic materials.
- -Describe magnets as having two poles.
- -Predict whether two magnets will attract or repel each other.



Key question:

Why are festivals important to religious communities?

We will be drawing some beautiful Rangoli patterns which links to some of our math's work on shape.
