OoSC - New After School Club Supervisor

OoSC After school club fees

We wanted to give you advanced notice that from the beginning of the summer term, Tuesday 23rd April 2019, we will be increasing the cost of After School Club sessions by £1.00 per session. The costs will therefore be £5.50 for the first child and £5.00 for any siblings.

The reluctant decision has been taken for a number of reasons; The club currently runs at a loss which is not sustainable in the current budgetary climate. Prices have not been increased since December 2017 and they remain much lower than all other care providers. The majority of clubs in the local area charge £9 or more and the next cheapest club costs £7.50. Even with the price increase, Courtney's club will remain significantly cheaper than all other local providers. The intention is not to make a profit from the club and the aspiration is that it continues to run as cost efficiently as possible.

The school is keen to support parents by accepting childcare vouchers (both the Government's and other private schemes). If you are able to obtain childcare vouchers through work and would like to use them for club, please











contact the office who can advise whether we already accept these vouchers or start the process of registration with the provider.

Head Injuries: New wrist bands

We are starting to use wrist bands to inform parents/carers of a child's head injury - rather than the stickers which can fall off clothing! We will continue to fill out full details on Accident Forms for your child to bring home.

Request to Administer Short Term Medication

The school will only administer medication where a '*request to administer medication*' form has been completed by the parent(s)/carer(s) of a pupil. No medication will be given unless this form is completed. It is the responsibility of the parent/carer to supply the medication which must be in the original packaging/container and must be in date; they must include the child's name, dosage and instructions for administration.

If a pupil comes to school with medication but no parent/carer notification the office staff will telephone the parent/carer to discuss and obtain verbal permission to administer the medication if appropriate, plus ask the parent/carer to complete a 'request to administer medication' form at the end of the school day or the earliest opportunity. Where verbal permission has been obtained this will be recorded on the 'record of short term medication administered' form.

Wherever possible medicines should be taken outside school hours.
