During the holiday, I received an email from local councillor, Pat Rooney, to raise concerns about "inconsiderate and dangerous parking on the junction of Wedmoor and Courtney Road at drop off and collection times." And that cars "are having to drive out into the middle of the road before they can see any traffic coming." Councillor Rooney has asked the Traffic Enforcement Officers to investigate.

- not park on the yellow zig-zags (they are there for a reason and ensure that a wide enough vision can be had at each exit gate)
