#### **Headteacher's News**

How time flies! This week we had the first 'stay and play' for our new Reception class children. They always look so tiny - some of them are only three years old at the moment. Looking back on the current Cherry class, they have come on so well in their first year at Courtney in all areas of their learning.

**Then:** When Ofsted visited about eighteen months ago, they said that in EYFS we needed to challenge our higher able children, be sharper with our assessments and design more exciting learning activities.

**Now:** We now provide an improved range of activities that excite the children and reflect their interests; we use our adults well so that they support and scaffold learning in child- initiated opportunities; our book-based work is stimulating and links with the whole school sequence; and we now use assessments more tightly so that learning is personalised. As a result we have a greater proportion of children working at exceeding levels in the prime areas of reading, writing and mathematics, and the local authority advisors who visit our school all judge our practice as good. Not only that, in Cherry class, we have a lovely group of happy children who have grown in confidence, have super learning behavior and are kind to each other. I couldn't be prouder.

Thank you so very much for the amazing amount of money raised at our sponsored Courtney K event. It was a great whole school team effort. Already the 'Playground Improvement Team' have had some markings drafted and we are hopeful that they could be in place for our current Y6 to use before they leave.

Courtney will be taking part in the South Gloucestershire Schools' Festival of Youth Sport for the first time this year with our Rugby team. Thanks to Mrs Parfrey, we have a new school banner with which to proudly parade. Our school has been given Poland as our link country. Powodzenia, Courtney.

## Science Week


