As part of our improvement plans, we have decided to convert the current ICT Suite; we are going to partition one part into a large group room and the other into a smaller group space and library area. This work will start in this February half-term. The library space created will allow the children be able to access both fiction and non-fiction books, and create an inviting optional area for hearing children read.

We do have some non-fiction books currently stored in topic boxes and we are exploring grants in order to fund the purchasing of new books but, as you know, they are very expensive.
