Headteacher's News

Yesterday, we had the first of our Parent Consultation Meetings with the focus, as a response to the Parent Survey, on Behaviour. We were due to review our Behaviour Policy anyway, so to get the opportunity to gather parental views before it happened, was invaluable. Nine parents came which represented Years 1,2,4,5 and 6. 'What's Going Well' included: the consistent use of the Behaviour Tree in every class which helps children understand right from wrong; stickers which support good behaviour and are worn proudly by the children; and the fact that the processes help children begin to manage their own behaviour.

'Even Better Ifs' included: the wish for the teachers in the younger year groups to be more explicit in their language when moving a child up or down the tree so they understand; the reliability of the text system when children get to gold; and the wish for parents/carers to be informed if consecutive weeks of Golden Time are missed.

As a result of this meeting, actions have been put in place and the Behaviour Policies being tweaked. Thank you to all of you who managed to attend and for Janet Hinchliffe, the Chair of Governors, who shared the Governors' role in monitoring.

And finally, last Saturday, we had the first of our Prospective Parents 2019 open event. I was hugely proud to show off the school - which is looking amazing - but also extremely proud of the children representing the different leadership groups (House, School Council, Digital Leaders) who came dressed in their school uniforms on their weekend to help show off the school to our visitors. Thank you to the staff, governors and FoCP who also came to support. Have a super weekend.
