My Life with JIA (Juvenile Idiopathic Arthritis) by Megan Bennett's

MY LIFE WITH J.I.A (JUVENILE IDIOPATHIC ARTHRITIS)

I was diagnosed with JIA in September 2007 when I was 20 months old.

JIA is an auto-immune condition. It means that my immune system attacks my joints. The powerful medication I take suppresses my immune system but that means I am more vulnerable to infections, which can make me very ill.

On some mornings I can't get out of bed because I feel very tired and achy. Sometimes my fingers really hurt too. I might stay in bed a bit longer and Mum will rub my legs. Some mornings I come downstairs on my bottom because my legs hurt too much to walk.

I have many hospital appointments with my Consultant, Specialist Nurse, Physio, O.T., Phlebotomists (people who do blood tests) and a Psychologist.

I also attend Bristol Eye Hospital because the type of Arthritis I have means that I have a high risk of getting Uveitis. This has no symptoms but can cause blindness if left untreated.

I have hydrotherapy on a Tuesday evening which I really enjoy. Swimming in lovely warm water helps to take the pain away.

Every day is different. My life is topsy-turvy. Some days I struggle to walk, write, get dressed, cut my food up, even brush my teeth. But on other days I can do all these things.

Some days are really tough but I try to do as much as I can, have fun and enjoy my life.
