Headteacher's News

It is becoming increasingly likely, looking at the rising confirmed COVID cases across the UK and the handful of schools affected in our locality, that our school may well get a confirmed case and consequently we need to be prepared in case we have to shut a bubble. Rest assured, our first port of call is always to consult the Local Authority and Public Health South West to get expert advice and to agree the actions needed. What if a bubble has to shut?

If we get a confirmed case then the children in that bubble would have to self-isolate for two weeks. Only the people who have had direct contact with the person tested positive would need to stay at home.

In the event of not being able to come to school, we will use a new blog and contact email address to send work similar to the method used during lockdown. The situation is slightly different from March as the teachers won't need to teach other bubbles so will probably have greater capacity. Also, as there are likely to be fewer children in one family trying to share one laptop, we are currently working on how we can live stream some of the lessons during the day; it is our hope that this will be able to be part of our lockdown offer.

What can parents and carers do to help keep our community as safe as we can?

- Stick as closely to your drop off and pick up times as you can (otherwise the playground becomes congested).
- Keep 2m away from other parents and carers (even if you are good friends) as social contact is how the virus is transferred.
- ullet In busy areas (just outside the doors and gates), please stand back as much as you can rather than crowding round.
- If you have older siblings joining you at pick up, ask them to join you once you have moved away from any busy area.
- \bullet Set off from home as soon as you can and avoid lingering to chat to friends.
- Keep your children close to you on entry and exit.
- Don't send your child into school if they are showing symptoms. Go for a test straight away.
- Stick to the latest government rules for social contact when you are not in school.

Thank you for all of your continued support and the helpful feedback you are giving us when you notice some aspect of our risk management arrangements could be improved. Have a lovely Autumnal weekend.

Assessment Week

Next week is our Assessment Week across the school. At this time of year, we carry out a series of tests and screeners so that we can 'Map, Master and Move Forward'.

YR have just had their baselines completed in the core areas of the learning so the EYFS team will continue to work on their next steps.

Y1 will be screened for their phonic knowledge and teacher assessed for Reading, Writing and Maths,

Y2 will have their first go at 'practice KS1 SAT' papers in Reading, Maths and Spelling. The tests are designed for the end of year outcome so we will expect there to be gaps especially in the areas not yet taught. It does, however, get the children familiar with what the test looks like and provides valuable information for the teacher to plan the 'next steps'.

Y2 will also be screened for their phonics knowledge ready for December when they will be 'officially' screened as they missed the statutory screening in June. The outcomes of this will be reported to the local authority. The children in Y3 who didn't achieve 'working at' in phonics when they were in Y1 will also be screened in preparation for a repeat screener in December.

Y3, Y4 and Y5 are tested three times during the year using NfER tests in Reading, Maths, Spelling and Grammar. The outcomes are used to plan each child's 'next steps' and to allow teachers and parents/carers to know where their child is in terms of age-related expectations (i.e. are they performing average, below average or above average). The results are used to track progress across KS2 so we can ensure that every child makes at least good progress.

Y6 will have their first go at a suite of 'practice KS2 SAT' papers in Reading, Maths, Spelling and Grammar. The tests are designed for the end of year outcome so we will expect there to be gaps especially in the areas not yet taught. It does, however, help the children develop test technique; understand the need for speed and stamina; and know the importance of checking answers. As with the other tests, it also provides valuable gaps analysis information for the teachers to plan the 'next steps'.

Some children absolutely love tests but some will need reassurance – we provide a lot in school but please do let us know if an extra bit of TLC is needed. There are a number of access arrangements we make for children who need it, for example, scribing for comprehension tests, rest breaks and reading for maths tests. For a handful of children with SEND across the school, the tests for their age group won't be appropriate so, for those, teachers will take a personalised approach.

Towards the start of Term 2, we will be holding remote 'parents' evenings as we did just before lockdown. At this meeting, the assessment data for your child will be shared, together with the gaps.

Each balloon costs £3, and because they are virtual, they are 100% eco-friendly. You can buy one balloon per family or as many balloons as you like to compete against other family members and friends!

Once purchased, you can decorate/customise your own balloon, changing parameters such as helium content, shape and colour.

The race starts on 31st October and runs for 7 days. It is a combined event with other national charities. National prizes for the race are:

Balloons are subject to a simulated flight pattern based on your balloon's individual flight parameters plus the real weather conditions at the actual time, such as the prevailing wind speed and current temperature.
