## Courtney K – Courtney Runs to Rome!

Thank you again to everyone who supported the Courtney K last week whether you came to the event, washed the paint splattered clothes afterwards or helped collect sponsorship money. We were absolutely overwhelmed by how every single child embraced the event, by how far they ran and most importantly by how much fun they had. It was a brilliant reminder of how amazing all our children are and how much potential they all have...



### Scores

We have now had a chance to add up how far everyone ran. It is really quite staggering. Each class ran:

Equivalent Distance as the crow flies:

<b>Reception</b>	107 km	Bristol to Winchester
<b>Year 1</b>	202 km	Bristol to Stanstead
<b>Year 2</b>	202 km	Bristol to the Eden Project
<b>Year 3</b>	256 km	Bristol to Aintree, Liverpool
<b>Year 4</b>	259 km	Bristol to Lands' End
<b>Year 5</b>	230 km	Bristol to Old Trafford, Manchester
<b>Year 6</b>	288 km	Bristol to the white cliffs of Dover



The total distance run by all staff and pupils was a staggering 1,627 km which is the equivalent distance of to **Rome** and a little bit beyond (as the crow flies). Astounding!
