New reading reward scheme – from September 2017

Thank you to all families and children who have enthusiastically engaged with our reading reward scheme – *Reading 5s,* this year. Following discussions with many children from EYFS to Year 6, we have decided to alter our reading reward scheme to reward every effort to read. However, our school expectation for every child to read at least five times a week remains.

Our new reading reward scheme will be called 'Reading 25s', which is an accumulative approach used successfully by many other schools. To put it simply, every day a child reads outside of school (listened to and recorded by a parent/carer) counts towards a certificate. When a child has 25 reads, a certificate will be given in assembly and the child's next goal is 50 reads. The certificates will ascend in multiples of 25. Over the summer holiday, your child can:

- Continue to work towards their 50 week certificate;
- Take part in the South Gloucestershire Summer Reading Challenge Animal Antics.
