Courtney K Challenge What you need to know:

Time: 1.30 – 3.00pm Friday 18th May. Parents Welcome to support

What children need to bring: clothes for running that can be splashed with water and paint (white if your child wants to have a splattered outfit as a souvenir), trainers, water bottle, goggles/sunglasses are optional (see below)

The powder paint: we will be using powder paint that is 99% cornflour. It meets EU regulations and should not cause any irritation. Adults will be throwing this at children's bodies but there is a small risk it may inadvertently get near children's eyes. Consequently, your child may wear sunglasses or goggles but these are brought to school at their own risk!! The powder paint may stain a little so we advise old clothes. If your child wants the coloured memento, we would advise you not to wash the top!!

Pick up: will be from the lower sports field at 3.15pm.

How you can help: please carry on encouraging your child to get sponsorship for the event, come and cheer our amazing runners on, on the day, please let the office know if you have a gazebo we could borrow or if you would like your child to opt out of the water/paint station.
